It gives me overwhelming joy to announce that our WASC appeal was approved, and we have been granted the full re-affirmation of our accreditation for the next six years!!! The appeal team was able to determine that while we acknowledge areas we will need to improve, we have demonstrated tremendous growth and success with our student learning and achievement. They also determined that members from the previous visiting team from last year demonstrated implicit bias and did not follow the required process for their review of our school. This means that we will continue to work on the areas we identified in our action plan, and we will send WASC a mid-term progress report in our third year of this cycle.
